Designed to support and celebrate independent editorial creation, Bold brings together artists, designers, and publishers, showcasing the boundless creativity of this independent scene.





#### **INVITED ARTISTS**

#### **STEPHEN GILL (NOBODY BOOKS)**

Stephen Gill is a British photographer and publisher. In 2005, he founded Nobody Books to publish his own work and to maintain control over every stage of the bookmaking process. Among his acclaimed — and now mostly sold-out — publications are *Hackney Flowers* (2007), *Night Procession* (2017), *The Pillar* (2019), and *Magnificent Failure* (2023).

His work can be found in numerous international public collections, including the National Portrait Gallery, Tate, and the Victoria and Albert Museum in London, as well as the Moderna Museet in Stockholm.

#### HANS GREMMEN AND PETRA STAVAST (FW:BOOKS)

Graphic designer Hans Gremmen works in the fields of photography, architecture, and visual arts, and has been recognised for his experimental projects. Together with Roma Publications, he co-founded ENTER ENTER, an exhibition space dedicated to the book in Amsterdam.

Visual artist Petra Stavast uses photography, film, and text to construct narratives from documentary materials, which she reassembles in her books and installations.

Founded in 2008, Fw:Books has published artists such as Bertien van Manen, Issei Suda, and Stephan Keppel.

### LIA PRADAL (ÉDITIONS PAÏEN)

Lia Pradal is an artist, graphic designer, and co-founder of Païen Editions. The book is at the core of her practice, which she approaches as an experimental space where images become raw material.

She explores different forms of publishing and works collaboratively within the fields of culture, photography, and publishing, developing an approach in which graphic design and artistic practice feed into each other.

# AT THE LIBRAIRIE SANS TITRE

Alongside Bold, the librairie sans titre will host two workshops focused on book distribution and bookmaking.

Opened in 2019 and located at 143 Avenue Parmentier in Paris, librairie sans titre focuses on contemporary art practices and has developed a significant section dedicated to photography, featuring a carefully curated selection of independent publications from France and abroad. As a space dedicated to sharing ideas, it brings together artists, publishers, designers, and lovers of the printed image.

TWO SESSIONS Book Practices: Editorial Binding and Dummy Layout With Ardalan Yaghoubi Workshop in French. 9 participants. Fee: €95

> This workshop offers a hands-on introduction to the essential steps of book production, designed for both self-publishing and artistic or photographic projects.

After an overview of the main paper formats and their editorial implications, participants will learn about various binding techniques, including the one used during the workshop. The session then focuses on creating a dummy layout: preparing the signatures, folding, assembling, and performing the fundamental bookmaking gestures, up to pressing the book under weight. Each participant leaves with a dummy they made themselves and a clear understanding of the steps involved in bringing a book to life.

Ardalan Yaghoubi is a trained bookbinder and holds a degree in illustration from HEAR Strasbourg. In 2023, he founded L.F.C, an independent publishing house dedicated to showcasing young contemporary illustration and comic artists. Alongside his editorial work, he teaches screen printing at Université Paris 1 and provides courses on printing and publishing at the Ateliers de Sèvres.

Understanding the Book Chain: Publishing Ecosystem and Self-Publishing **Practices** 

With Oscar Ginter

Workshop in French. 12 - 15 participants. Fee: €60

This workshop offers a hands-on introduction to the book circulation process, revealing the economic mechanisms that shape each stage, from production to shelving. Participants will also learn how self-publishing develops its own strategies and business models.

Using concrete examples, the workshop provides essential insights into what allows a publishing project to come to life, circulate, and reach its audience.

Oscar Ginter is a graphic designer, publisher, and printer based in Paris. Trained at Penninghen, he founded Quintal in 2017, a risograph studio that has since become both a printing house and a publishing company, complemented in 2023 by a bookstore dedicated to micro-editions. He also runs Rien Ne Va Plus (rnvp), a publishing house focused on photography.

Through these various projects, he explores contemporary forms of printed production and the ways in which images circulate within independent publishing.
